Difference between Advocacy, BCC and IEC

You might have come across the terms "Behaviour Change Communication (BCC)" and "Information Education and Communication (IEC)". Just like advocacy, BCC and IEC are centred on raising awareness on a particular issue with the intention of creating change.

So what is the difference between BCC/IEC and advocacy?

Advocacy and BCC/IEC initiatives both concern raising awareness about a particular issue with the intention of creating change. However, BCC/IEC activities seek to change individuals' behaviour, whereas advocacy activities aim to mobilise collective action and to achieve change in policies or laws.
