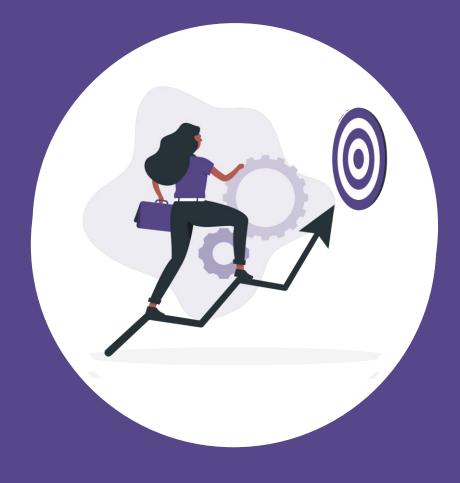

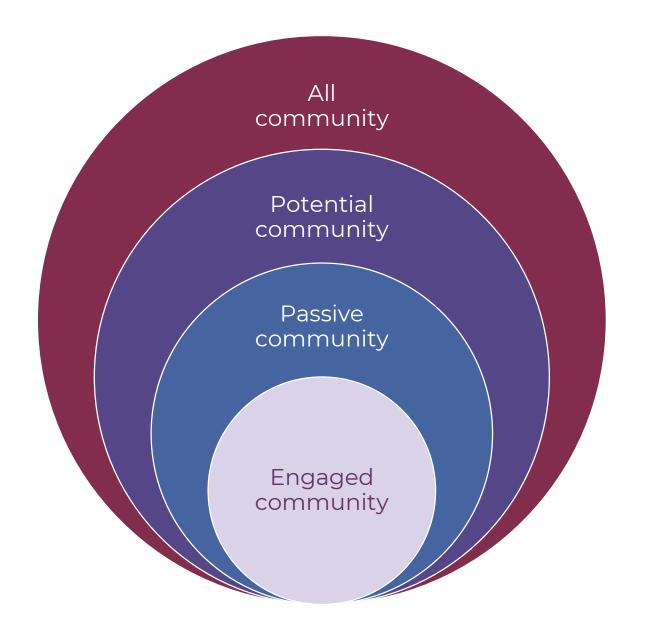
A digital community is:

- and participate because they feel they get something out of it (there is a benefit).



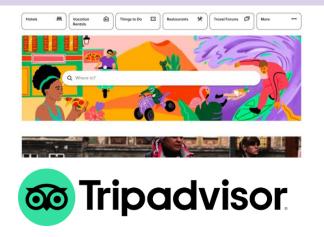


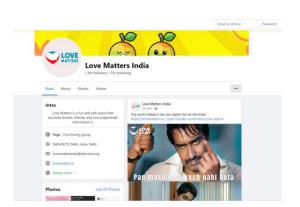
The different layers of a digital community





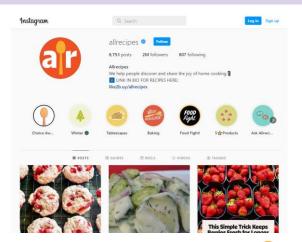

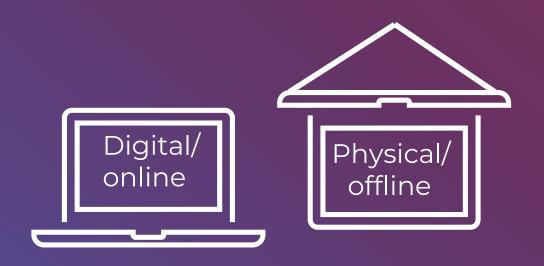

- 1. Repeated harassment using electronic devices and networked technology that includes threats of harm, or that is highly intimidating and intrusive upon one's personal privacy. and forth between individuals repeatedly.
- **2.** Sending angry, rude, or obscene messages directed at a person or persons privately or an online group. A "flamewar" erupts when "flames" are sent back.
- 3. Deliberately misleading or biased information; manipulated narrative or facts; propaganda.
- **4.** Unsolicited words or actions intended to annoy, alarm, or abuse another individual. Often based on a protected status (e.g., sex, race, disability, or sexual orientation).
- **5.** False news stories, often of a sensational nature, created to be widely shared or distributed for the purpose of generating revenue, or promoting or discrediting a public figure, political movement, company, etc.
- 6. False information that is spread, regardless of whether there is intent to mislead.
- **7.** A deliberately offensive or provocative online posting with the aim of upsetting someone or eliciting an angry response from them
- **8.** Intentional and repeated harm inflicted through the use of computers, cell phones, and other electronic devices.
- **9.** Expression that attacks a specific aspect of a person's identity, such as their race, ethnicity, gender identity, religion, sexual orientation, disability, etc.
- **10.** The publishing of sensitive personal information online—including home address, email, phone number, social security number, photos, etc.—to harass, intimidate, extort, stalk, or steal the identity of a target.

ACTIVE, NOT PASSIVE

 A safe space should not be a passive space where people simply go for safety, but one in which they participate and contribute to its establishment and maintenance.

SAFE AND BRAVE

 A safe space can also be a brave space. It is a place where people are encouraged to challenge their misconceptions and express wrong and misleading information without fearing judgement or else.

DIGITAL SAFETY

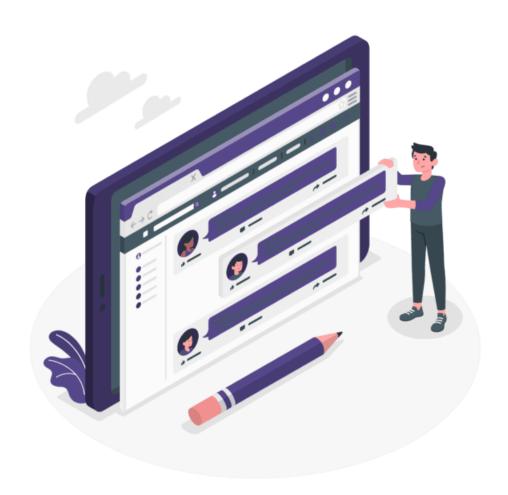
 A safe space is also a space where people can understand what tools they can use to protect themselves, considering the limitations of digital safety.



ONLINE COMMUNITY MODERATION







Moderation means different things to different people and a large part of an organisation's approach to moderation is contingent on their understanding of what it is and what they are trying to achieve.

For most digital platforms, moderation refers to the practice of managing content, comments and discussions by applying a pre-determined set of rules and guidelines.



Why is community moderation important?



It can help build a vibrant, respectful and inclusive digital community by encouraging participants to actively engage in conversation.



It can offer you the chance to set the tone, bring users back on topic, and answer users' questions.



It can diffuse tense conversations, provide additional information and propagate a healthy, safe and respectful dialogue.



What is community moderation to RNW MEDIA?

- Careful strategic moderation of online conversations helps build trust among community members who then feel safe to express themselves freely.

"Falling in love with a transgender person": the article is written by an Egyptian transwoman and tackles dating for the transgender community in Egypt.

Comment: I really object. This is prohibited in our religion, and this is just your effort to justify perversion! You are promoting very abnormal behaviour!

Post 1

Context: Being transgender is not illegal in Egypt, however, it is very difficult and the steps you need to take to receive medical care are very long. It is also almost impossible to change official documents to reflect the gender you identify with.

Context: Sex remains a taboo topic in the MENA region, and content about it is only approved by the majority if targets married people or those preparing to get married soon.

Post 2

"Dry humping: a fun and safe practice": an article about outercourse as a pleasurable and relatively safe sexual practice.

Comment: This is a secular page. It aims to disintegrate the values and principles of all religions. And about this post, he talks about girls before marriage.. The aim is to educate them that there is no problem in your having sex, even without marriage, and it is also an enjoyable type of sex so that every virgin will be drawn to it.



"Discover it for yourself - sex toys": a discussion

Problem: One of the female users takes part in the discussion and then some male users start asking her to check her inbox and send her inappropriate messages.

Problem: A female user is sharing screenshots of messages she received after leaving a comment on our posts. The screenshots contain attempts by random men to chat.
